Location	<p>Hilo on the Island of Hawai'i (Big Island)</p> <p>Hilo is located on the southernmost island of the Hawaiian Island chain. Hilo is a city of about 40,000 people and located on Hilo Bay under the picturesque background of the snow-covered Mauna Kea – the largest mountain the Pacific. Hilo is surrounded by a tropical rainforest on the warm, wet side of the Big Island. The temperature is consistent year-round staying between 17- 29 degrees Celsius. Academic Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • B (3.0) average and one year of college completed. • Students with a 61 iBT TOEFL, an IELTS score of 5.5, Duolingo 90, or Eiken 2A score will not be required to take ESL classes. Students with lower scores or no scores will be admitted into English Language Institute and required to take the ESL classes that they place into. All ESL classes receive academic credit and appear on the academic transcript.

Transcripts	One transcript for each student will be sent to the home university. If students or universities want additional transcripts, they can be ordered from the UH Hilo Transcript Webpage .
ACCOMMODATION	
Accommodation options	Exchange students can apply for on-campus dormitory housing or arrange off-campus accommodations. The University of Hawaii at Hilo cannot guarantee housing. However, we will assist students in securing on-campus housing or off-campus housing near campus. Students can apply online for on-campus housing through the University of Hawai'i at Hilo Housing Office website. The application must be completed AFTER students have received their acceptance and a UH student ID number.

COSTS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION	
Tuition	One Semester \$5,724 (150% of resident tuition) Two Semesters \$11,448 (150% of resident tuition)
Required Student Fees	Activity Fee: (\$354.50 per semester (Student Life Center, Student Medical Center, student publications and activities) * Center for Global Education and Exchange Fee: \$200 one time (activities, excursions, peer support) New Student Engagement Fee: \$200 one time (orientation activities, first-year experience activities) excursions, peer support) See UH Hilo Fee Schedule website
Medical Insurance	All international exchange students are required to purchase the University of Hawai'i at Hilo medical insurance plan while they are studying at UH Hilo. Visit the International Student Service website to see the requirements. The University of Hawai'i at Hilo insurance plan costs approximately \$850 per semester. Information about the plan can be viewed at the GeoBlue insurance website . A copy of your health insurance needs to be filed with the International Student Services upon arrival.
Living Costs	On campus: (Estimated based on 2025-26 rates) Housing: \$1,861-\$3,308 per semester (depending on dormitory and type of room) Food service: \$2,833-\$3,284 per semester (depending on meal plan choice) Off campus: (Estimated) Housing: \$600 to \$800 per month. Personal expenses (food, supplies, transport): \$4,000 per semester

Other Expenses	Transportation: The city bus is free for everyone at this time. Students may also borrow bicycles from the UH Hilo Student Life Center for 24 hour periods free of charge. Some students choose to buy bicycles which range from \$150 to \$1,000. Occasionally students buy used cars which can cost from \$3,500 and up. Students with cars are legally required to have automobile insurance and a valid Hawaii state driver's license or a current international driver's license.
Visa Information	All exchange students must have a valid passport and an F1 student visa. The university will provide an I-20 to be used to get the visa from a U.S. Embassy or Consulate. Students must bring the I-20 and passport when entering the United States.
Pre-Arrival Information	Accepted students will be contacted directly by the Center for Global Education and Exchange as well as the Director of International Student Services with information about arrival and orientation. Students should be sure to read all emails very carefully. Airport pickup is available on designated days prior to orientation. Those dates will be announced by email after students have been accepted. Students who arrive outside of the designated pickup dates can take a taxi or a ride share service (Uber or Lyft) to the campus from the airport. The campus is about 10 minutes from the airport and the taxi ride costs \$15-\$25. Please visit the International Student Services website for more information.
